The Directors have determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders on Saturday, 25 November 2023 at 9:00am (WST).

The Explanatory Memorandum provides additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the Proxy Form form part of the Notice.

Terms and abbreviations used in the Notice are defined in Schedule 1.

2 **Resolutions**

Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a **non-binding** ordinary resolution the following:

That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2023.

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Resolution 2 – Election of Director – Gerard Kaczmarek

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That in accordance with article 7.6(c) of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Gerard Kaczmarek, a Director appointed on 28 February 2023, retires and, being eligible and offering himself for election, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Resolution 3 – Election of Director – William Troy Irvin

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That in accordance with article 7.6(c) of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, William Troy Irvin, a Director appointed on 2 May 2023, retires and, being eligible and offering himself for election, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Resolution 4 – Approval of 10% Placement Capacity

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a **special** resolution the following:

'That pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of Equity Securities totalling up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Voting exclusion

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 4 if at the time of the Meeting, the Company is proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity, by or on behalf of any persons who are expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any associate of those persons.

The above voting exclusion does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting prohibitions

Resolution 1: In accordance with sections 250BD and 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of such a member.

A vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- (a) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

1. Introduction

2. Action to be taken by Shareholders

Shareholders should read the Notice including the Explanatory Memorandum carefully before deciding how to vote on the Resolutions.

2.1 **Proxies**

Shareholders are encouraged to vote by voting online or by completing a Proxy Form.

Lodgement of a Proxy Form will not preclude a Shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

Lodgement instructions (which include the ability to lodge proxies electronically) are set out in the Proxy Form to the Notice of Meeting.

2.2 Chair's voting intentions

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

If the Chair is your proxy, either by appointment or by default, and you have not indicated your voting intention, you expressly authorise the Chair to exercise the proxy in respect of Resolution 1, even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of the Company's Key Management Personnel.

3. Annual Report

In accordance with section 317 of the Corporations Act, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Annual Report, including the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2023.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

- (a) discuss the Annual Report which is available online at <u>www.daciangold.com.au</u>;
- (b) ask questions about, or comment on, the management of the Company; and
- (c) ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than five business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

4. **Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report**

In accordance with subsection 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with subsection 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors. If, Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

Under the Corporations Act if, at two consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report, then a further resolution (Spill Resolution) may be required to be considered at the second annual general meeting as to whether a further meeting be convened to put certain Directors to re-election. The Directors to be put to re-election are those Directors, other than the Managing Director, who were Directors when the resolution to make the directors report was passed.

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the requirement for a Spill Resolution will not arise at this Meeting irrespective of the outcome of the vote on Resolution 1.

If you are appointing the Chair as your proxy, please note that the proxy form accompanying this Notice expressly authorises the Chair to vote any undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1 even though the resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel. Accordingly, if you are appointing the Chair as your proxy and do not wish your proxy to vote in favour of Resolution 1, you will need to mark "against" or "abstain" where indicated in the proxy form in relation to Resolution 1.

The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

Given the personal interests of all Directors in this Resolution, the Board makes no recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

5. **Resolution 2 – Election of Director – Gerard Kaczmarek**

5.1 General

Article 7.6(c) of the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 both provide that a Director (excluding the Managing Director) appointed to fill a causal vacancy must not hold office without re-election past the next annual general meeting.

A Director who retires in accordance with article 7.6(c) and Listing Rule 14.4 holds office until the conclusion of the Meeting but is eligible for re-election.

On 28 February 2023, Mr Gerard Kaczmarek was appointed as a Non-Executive Director of the Company. Accordingly, Mr Kaczmarek retires at this Meeting and, being eligible, seeks reelection pursuant to this Resolution 3.

5.2 Mr Gerard Kaczmarek

B.Ec (Acc), CPA, AICD

Mr Gerry Kaczmarek has almost 40 years' experience predominantly in the resource sector, specialising in finance and company management with several emerging and leading mid-tier Australian gold companies.

Mr Kaczmarek was Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary for Saracen Mineral Holdings (ASX:SAR) from 2012 to 2016. He served as Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary at Troy Resources (ASX:TRY) from 1998 to 2008 and from 2017 to 2019.

Earlier in his career, he held a range of positions with the CRA / Rio Tinto group and was Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary for a number of other mid-tier and junior mining companies. Mr Kaczmarek is currently an Independent Non-Executive Director of Genesis Minerals Ltd.

Mr Kaczmarek holds a Bachelor of Economics (specialising in Accounting) degree from the Australian National University and is a member of CPA Australia and the AICD.

The Company confirms that it took appropriate checks into Mr Kaczmarek's background and experience and that these checks did not identify any information of concern.

If elected, Mr Kaczmarek is not considered to be an independent Director because he is a nominee Director of Genesis Minerals Limited, a company which holds an interest of 80.08% in the Company.

Mr Kaczmarek has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

5.3 Board recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Kaczmarek who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) supports the election of Mr Kaczmarek for the following reasons:

- (a) Mr Kaczmarek's experience as a finance executive in mineral resources companies is complimentary and valuable to the Board's existing skills and experience;
- (b) Mr Kaczmarek's background as a finance executive with decades of experience with mineral and resources companies will assist the Company across a diverse range of

governance and compliance, and equity capital markets. This valuable insight will further assist with the direction with the Company; and

(c) on the basis of Mr Kaczmarek's skills, qualifications and experience, the Board (with Mr Kaczmarek abstaining) recommends Shareholders vote in favour of the election of Mr Kaczmarek.

6. **Resolution 3 – Election of Director – William Troy Irvin**

6.1 General

Article 7.6(c) of the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 both provide that a Director (excluding the Managing Director) appointed to fill a causal vacancy must not hold office without re-election past the next annual general meeting.

A Director who retires in accordance with article 7.6(c) and Listing Rule 14.4 holds office until the conclusion of the Meeting but is eligible for re-election.

On 2 May 2023, Mr William Troy Irvin was appointed as a Non-Executive Director of the Company. Accordingly, Mr Irvin retires at this Meeting and, being eligible, seeks re-election pursuant to this Resolution 4.

6.2 **Mr William Troy Irvin**

B Eng (Mining), Grad Dip App Fin

Mr Irvin is a proven mining executive, specialising in business development, investor relations and corporate strategy. Mr Irvin is currently Corporate Development Officer at Genesis Minerals. From 2015 to 2021 he was Corporate Development Officer at Saracen Mineral Holdings. Mr Irvin also spent a decade working in institutional sales and research at a leading stockbroking firm.

He brings deep relationships in the global capital markets, particularly with funds investing in natural resources. Mr Irvin has tertiary qualifications in Mining Engineering (WA School of Mines in Kalgoorlie) and Applied Finance and Investment.

The Company confirms that it took appropriate checks into Mr Irvin's background and experience and that these checks did not identify any information of concern.

If elected, Mr Irvin is not considered to be an independent Director because he is a nominee Director of Genesis Minerals Limited, a company which holds an interest of 80.08% in the Company.

Mr Irvin has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

6.3 Board recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Irvin who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) supports the election of Mr Irvin for the following reasons:

(a) Mr Irvin's experience as a finance executive in mineral resources companies is complimentary and valuable to the Board's existing skills and experience;

- (b) Mr Irvin background as a finance executive with decades of experience with mineral and resources companies will assist the Company across a diverse range of governance and compliance, and equity capital markets. This valuable insight will further assist with the direction with the Company; and
- (c) on the basis of Mr Irvin skills, qualifications and experience, the Board (with Mr Irvin abstaining) recommends Shareholders vote in favour of the election of Mr Irvin.

7. Resolution 4 – Approval of 10% Placement Capacity

7.1 Background

Listing Rule 7.1A provides that an eligible entity may seek Shareholder approval at its annual general meeting to allow it to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its issued capital through placements over a 12 month period after the annual general meeting (**10% Placement Capacity**). The 10% Placement Capacity is in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval by way of a special resolution to provide the Company the ability to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity during the 10% Placement Period (refer to Section 7.2(f) below).

If Shareholders approve Resolution 44, the number of Equity Securities to be issued under the 10% Placement Capacity will be determined in accordance with the formula set out in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (refer to Section 7.2(c) below).

If Resolution 44 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in the Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further shareholder approval.

If Resolution 44 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing equity securities without shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

7.2 Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Is the Company an eligible entity?

An eligible entity for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A is an entity that is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less.

The Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of approximately \$152 million, based on the closing price of Shares on 12 October 2023.

If on the date of the Meeting, the Company's market capitalisation exceeds \$300 million or it has been included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index, this Resolution 44 will no longer be effective and will be withdrawn.

(b) What Equity Securities can be issued?

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Capacity must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the eligible entity.

As at the date of the Notice, the Company has on issue one quoted class of Equity Securities; Shares.

(c) How many Equity Securities can be issued?

Listing Rule 7.1A.2 provides that under the approved 10% Placement Capacity, the Company may issue or agree to issue a number of Equity Securities calculated in accordance with the following formula:

Where:

- **A** is the number of Shares on issue 12 months before the date of issue or agreement:
 - (A) plus the number of fully paid Shares issued in the 12 months:
 - (1) under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 (other than exception 9, 16 or 17);
 - (2) on the conversion of convertible securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 9 where:
 - the convertible securities were issued or agreed to be issued before the 12 month period; or
 - the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4;
 - (3) under an agreement to issue securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - the agreement was entered into before the 12 month period; or
 - the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to be approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4; and
 - (4) with Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4. This does not include any issue of Shares under the Company's 15% annual placement capacity without Shareholder approval;
 - (B) plus the number of partly paid shares that became fully paid in the 12 months; and
 - (C) less the number of fully paid Shares cancelled in the 12 months.

Note that 'A' has the same meaning in Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating the Company's 15% annual placement capacity.

D is 10%.

E is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months immediately preceding the date of issue or agreement to issue where the issue or agreement has not been subsequently approved by the holders of Ordinary Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.4.

(d) What is the interaction with Listing Rule 7.1?

The Company's ability to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A will be in addition to its 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

(e) At what price can the Equity Securities be issued?

Any Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.1A must be issued for a cash consideration per security which is not less than 75% of the VWAP of Equity Securities in the same class calculated over the 15 Trading Days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 Trading Days of the date in paragraph (i) above, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued,

(Minimum Issue Price).

(f) When can Equity Securities be issued?

Shareholder approval of the 10% Placement Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A will be valid from the date of Meeting and will expire on the earlier to occur of:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of the Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; or
- (iii) the time and date of Shareholder approval of a transaction under Listing Rules 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking),

(10% Placement Period).

(g) What is the effect of Resolution 44?

The effect of Resolution 44 will be to allow the Directors to issue the Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A during the 10% Placement Period without further Shareholder approval or using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

7.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3A, the following information is provided in relation to the 10% Placement Capacity:

(a) Final date for issue

The Company will only issue the Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity during the 10% Placement Period (refer to Section 7.2(f) above).

Shareholder approval of the 10% Placement Capacity will cease to be valid if Shareholders approve a transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 or 11.2.

(b) Minimum issue price

Where the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity, it will only do so for cash consideration and the issue price will be not less than the Minimum Issue Price (refer to Section 7.2(e) above).

(c) Purposes of issues under 10% Placement Capacity

The Company may seek to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity for cash consideration in order to raise funds for continued investment and development in the Company's current assets, the acquisition and development of new assets or investments (including expenses associated with such an acquisition and development), and/or for general working capital.

The Company will comply with the disclosure obligations under Listing Rule 7.1A.4 and 3.10.3 upon issue of any Equity Securities.

(d) Risk of economic and voting dilution

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- the market price for the Company's Equity Securities may be significantly lower on the date of the issue of the Equity Securities than on the date of the Meeting; and
- (ii) the Equity Securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for the Company's Equity Securities on the issue date,

which may have an effect on the amount of funds raised by the issue of the Equity Securities.

If this Resolution is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity, the existing Shareholders' economic and voting power in the Company may be diluted as shown in the below table (in the case of Options, only if the Options are converted into Shares).

The below table shows the potential dilution of existing Shareholders based on the current market price of Shares and the current number of Shares for 'A' calculated in accordance with the formula in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (see Section 7.2(c)) as at the date of the Notice (**Variable A**), with:

- (i) two examples where Variable A has increased, by 50% and 100%; and
- (ii) two examples of where the issue price of Shares has decreased by 50% and increased by 100% as against the current market price.

Notes:

- 1. The table has been prepared on the following assumptions:
 - (a) The issue price is the current market price (\$0.125), being the closing price of the Shares on ASX on 12 October 2023, being the latest practicable date before this Notice was signed.
 - (b) Variable A is 1,216,800,938 comprising the number of Shares currently on issue. This assumes that the Company has not issued any Shares in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 or with Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.4.
 - (c) The Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 10% Placement Capacity.
 - (d) No convertible securities are exercised or converted into Shares before the date of the issue of the Equity Securities.
 - (e) The issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity consists only of Shares. If the issue of Equity Securities includes quoted Options, it is assumed that those quoted Options are exercised into Shares for the purpose of calculating the voting dilution effect on existing Shareholders.
- 2. The number of Shares on issue (ie Variable A) may increase as a result of issues of Shares that do not require Shareholder approval (for example, a pro rata entitlements issue, scrip issued under a takeover offer or upon exercise of convertible securities) or future specific placements under Listing Rule 7.1 that are approved at a future Shareholders' meeting.
- 3. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.
- 4. The table does not show an example of dilution that may be caused to a particular Shareholder by reason of placements under the 10% Placement Capacity, based on that Shareholder's holding at the date of the Meeting.
- 5. The table shows only the effect of issues of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A, not under the 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

7.4 Voting exclusion statement

A voting exclusion statement is included in this Notice. As at the date of this Notice, the Company has not invited any existing Shareholder to participate in an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A. Therefore, no existing Shareholders will be excluded from voting on Resolution 44.

However, in the event that between the date of the Notice and the date of the Meeting, the Company proposes to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A to one or more existing Shareholders, those Shareholders' votes will be excluded under the voting exclusion statement in the Notice.

7.5 Additional information

Resolution 44 is a **special resolution** and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders eligible to vote.
